Between Westar and KCP&L, three shareholder meetings* soon will occur closely together, so we wanted to take a moment and clarify what you should expect.

First, Westar recently announced it will conduct its Annual Shareholder Meeting on Wednesday, Oct. 25, in Topeka. This is where they conduct typical business, like approving auditors and directors. The event is usually held in May but was postponed because the original merger was anticipated to close in April.

Second, both Westar and Great Plains Energy will separately conduct *special merger-related* shareholder meetings on Tuesday, **Nov. 21**, at 10 a.m. At those sessions, shareholders will gather specifically to vote on the new merger.
